This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Type

The product is in the form of a warrant issued under German law. It is not an interest bearing security.

Term

The product has a fixed term and will be due on March 18, 2026.

Objectives

The product provides the potential for capital growth and does not pay interest. What you will receive at the end of the term of the product is not certain and will depend on the performance of the EUR/GBP exchange rate expressed as GBP per EUR 1.00 (in particular, the WM Company LDN 4pm Mid exchange rate) (the underlying asset). You will take the risk that some or all of the value of your investment may be lost upon termination of the product. The product has a fixed term, ending on March 18, 2026. The price of each warrant is scaled by a factor of 100, representing the exposure to the underlying asset. The issue price is EUR 3.32. The product will be listed on both the Munich Stock Exchange and the Boerse Stuttgart (Open Market (EUWAX)). The issue date is March 21, 2025.

Repayment at maturity:

For each warrant that you hold there are two scenarios:

- If the fixing level of the underlying asset on March 13, 2026 is above GBP 0.84, you will on March 18, 2026 receive a cash amount equal to the fixing level of the underlying asset on March 13, 2026 minus GBP 0.84. The result will be multiplied by 100 and will be converted into EUR using the WM Company LDN 4pm Mid exchange rate on March 13, 2026; or
- Otherwise, you will receive no payment and you will lose your entire investment.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the underlying asset, the product and the product manufacturer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

Intended retail investor The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who:

- have advanced knowledge and a comprehensive understanding of the product, its market and its specific risks and rewards, with relevant financial industry experience including either frequent trading or large holdings in products of a similar nature, risk and complexity;
- seek capital growth, hedging and/or leveraged performance, expect the movement in the underlying asset to perform in a way that generates a favourable return and have an investment horizon of the recommended holding period specified below;
- accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product but otherwise are able to bear a total loss of their investment; and
- are willing to accept a level of risk to achieve potential returns that is consistent with the summary risk indicator shown below.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until March 18, 2026.



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 7 out of 7, which is the highest risk class. This takes into account two elements: (1) the market risk - that the potential losses for future performance are rated at a very high level; and (2) the credit risk - that poor market conditions are deemed very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

The favourable moderate unfavourable and stress scenarios represent possible outcomes that have been calculated based on simulations using the past performance of the underlying asset over a period of up to 5 years. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances.

What happens if Goldman Sachs Bank Europe SE is unable to pay out?

You are exposed to the risk that the Issuer might be unable to fulfil its obligations in respect of the product – e.g. in the event of insolvency (inability to pay / over-indebtedness) or an administrative order of resolution measures. In case of a crisis of the Issuer such an order can also be issued by a resolution authority in the run-up of an insolvency proceeding. Thereby the resolution authority has extensive intervention powers. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 10 months and 2 weeks

The recommended holding period for the product is 10 months and 2 weeks as the product is designed to be held until maturity; however the product may terminate early due to an extraordinary event. You have no contractual right to terminate the product prior to maturity.

The manufacturer is under no obligation to make a secondary market in the product, but may repurchase the product prior to maturity on a case-by-case basis. In addition the product is expected to be listed on Munich Stock Exchange and Boerse Stuttgart (Open Market (EUWAX)), which may provide you the possibility to sell the product prior to maturity via these exchanges. In such circumstances, the price quoted will reflect a bid-ask spread and any costs associated with unwinding the hedging arrangements of the manufacturer in connection with the product. In addition, the person who sold you the product may charge you brokerage fees when you sell the product.
