This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

## What is this product?

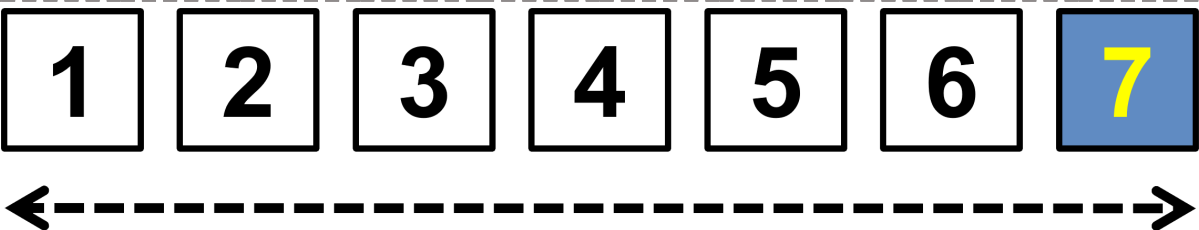
Type	The product is in the form of a warrant issued under German law. It is not an interest bearing security.
Term	The product has a fixed term and will be due on September 23, 2026.
Objectives	<p>The product provides the potential for capital growth and does not pay interest. What you will receive at the end of the term of the product is not certain and will depend on the performance of the ordinary shares of Exxon Mobil Corporation (ISIN: US30231G1022), listed on the New York Stock Exchange (the <b>underlying asset</b>). You will take the risk that some or all of the value of your investment may be lost upon termination of the product. The product has a variable term that depends on whether and when you exercise the product. However, the term of the product will end no later than on September 23, 2026. The price of each warrant is scaled by a factor of 0.1, representing the exposure to the underlying asset. The issue price is EUR 1.21. The product will be listed on both the Munich Stock Exchange and the Boerse Stuttgart (Open Market (EUWAX)). The issue date is June 2, 2025.</p> <p><b>Repayment at maturity:</b></p> <p>For each warrant that you hold there are two scenarios:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If the closing price of the underlying asset on the valuation date is above USD 100, you will on the maturity date receive a cash amount equal to the closing price of the underlying asset on the valuation date minus USD 100. The result will be multiplied by 0.1 and will be converted into EUR using the WM Company LDN 4pm Mid exchange rate on the valuation date; or</li> <li><i>Otherwise</i>, you will receive no payment and you will lose your entire investment.</li> </ol> <p>If you exercise the product, the valuation date will be the day on which you exercise the product and the maturity date will be the date falling 3 business days following this date. If you do not exercise the product, the valuation date will be September 18, 2026 and the maturity date will be September 23, 2026.</p> <p>The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the underlying asset, the product and the product manufacturer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.</p>

**Intended retail investor** The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who:

- have advanced knowledge and a comprehensive understanding of the product, its market and its specific risks and rewards, with relevant financial industry experience including either frequent trading or large holdings in products of a similar nature, risk and complexity;
- seek capital growth, hedging and/or leveraged performance, expect the movement in the underlying asset to perform in a way that generates a favourable return and have an investment horizon of the recommended holding period specified below;
- accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product but otherwise are able to bear a total loss of their investment; and
- are willing to accept a level of risk to achieve potential returns that is consistent with the summary risk indicator shown below.

## What are the risks and what could I get in return?

**Risk indicator**





The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until September 23, 2026.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 7 out of 7, which is the highest risk class. This takes into account two elements: (1) the market risk - that the potential losses for future performance are rated at a very high level; and (2) the credit risk - that poor market conditions are deemed very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

Inflation erodes the purchasing value of cash over time and this may result in the decline in real terms of any capital reimbursed.

**Performance scenarios** What you will get from this product depends on future market performance. Market developments in the future are uncertain and cannot be accurately predicted.

The scenarios shown are illustrations based on results from the past and on certain assumptions. Markets could develop very differently in the future.

The favourable, moderate, unfavourable and stress scenarios represent possible outcomes that have been calculated based on simulations using the past performance of the underlying asset over a period of up to 5 years. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances.

The figures shown include all the costs of the product itself, but may not include all the costs that you pay to your advisor or distributor. The figures do not take into account your personal tax situation, which may also affect how much you get back.

## What happens if Goldman Sachs Bank Europe SE is unable to pay out?

You are exposed to the risk that the Issuer might be unable to fulfil its obligations in respect of the product – e.g. in the event of insolvency (inability to pay / over-indebtedness) or an administrative order of resolution measures. In case of a crisis of the Issuer such an order can also be issued by a resolution authority in the run-up of an insolvency proceeding. Thereby the resolution authority has extensive intervention powers. Among other things, it can reduce rights of the investors to zero, terminate the product or convert it into shares of the Issuer and suspend rights of the investors. A total loss of your capital invested is possible. The product is a debt instrument and as such is not covered by any deposit protection scheme.

## What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

### Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest and how long you hold the product. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.

\*This illustrates how costs reduce your return each year over the holding period. For example it shows that if you exit at the recommended holding period your average return per year is projected to be -45.7% before costs and -47.6% after costs.

## How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

### **Recommended holding period: 1 year and 2 months**

The recommended holding period for the product is 1 year and 2 months as the product is designed to be held until maturity; however the product may terminate early due to an extraordinary event. You have no contractual right to terminate the product prior to maturity.

The manufacturer is under no obligation to make a secondary market in the product, but may repurchase the product prior to maturity on a case-by-case basis. In addition the product is expected to be listed on Munich Stock Exchange and Boerse Stuttgart (Open Market (EUWAX)), which may provide you the possibility to sell the product prior to maturity via these exchanges. In such circumstances, the price quoted will reflect a bid-ask spread and any costs associated with unwinding the hedging arrangements of the manufacturer in connection with the product. In addition, the person who sold you the product may charge you brokerage fees when you sell the product.

## How can I complain?
