

Key Information Document

Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Type

The product is in the form of a certificate issued under English law. It is an interest bearing security. The payment obligations of the product manufacturer are not guaranteed by any entity.

Term

The product has a fixed term and will be due on November 10, 2025, subject to an early redemption.

Objectives

The product pays a fixed rate of interest. What you will receive at the end of the term of the product is not certain and will depend on the performance of the preference shares of Volkswagen AG (ISIN: DE0007664039), listed on XETRA (the underlying asset). However, you will take the risk that some or all of the value of your investment may be lost at the end of the term of the product. The term of the product will end no later than November 10, 2025. However, we have the right to terminate the product early. Each certificate has a face value of EUR 100. The issue price is EUR 100. The product will be listed on Borsa Italiana (SeDeX). The issue date is November 8, 2022.

Interest: On each interest payment date, you will receive interest of EUR 0.40 for each certificate that you hold. Interest payment dates are each business day rolling monthly from December 8, 2022 (inclusive) to November 8, 2025 (inclusive).

Call feature: We have the right to terminate the product early on each call payment date upon 5 trading days notice, being the corresponding call dates. In this case you will receive EUR 100.00 in addition to the interest payable on or around such date for each certificate that you hold. Call payment dates are each business day rolling monthly from May 8, 2023 (inclusive) to October 8, 2025 (inclusive).

Repayment at maturity:

This section applies only if we do not terminate the product early as described above.

On November 10, 2025, for each certificate that you hold:

- If the closing price of the underlying asset on November 3, 2025 is at least equal to the barrier price, you will receive
- Otherwise, you will receive EUR 100.00 multiplied by (i) the closing price of the underlying asset on November 3, 2025 divided by (ii) the strike price of the underlying asset.

The initial reference price is EUR 117.307919, which is the closing price of the underlying asset on November 8, 2022. The strike price is EUR 117.307919, which is 100.00% of the initial reference price. The barrier price is EUR 41.05777165, which is 35.00% of the initial reference price.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the underlying asset, the product and the product manufacturer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

Intended retail investor The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who:

- have the ability to make an informed investment decision through sufficient knowledge and understanding of the product and its specific risks and rewards, with experience of investing in and/or holding a number of similar products providing a similar market exposure;
- seek income, expect the movement in the underlying asset to perform in a way that generates a favourable return, have an investment horizon of the recommended holding period specified below and understand that the product may terminate early;
- accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product but otherwise are able to bear a total loss of their investment; and
- are willing to accept a level of risk to achieve potential returns that is consistent with the summary risk indicator shown below.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?





The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until November 10, 2025.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 6 out of 7, which is the second-highest risk class. This takes into account two elements: (1) the market risk - that the potential losses for future performance are rated at a high level; and (2) the credit risk - that poor market conditions are deemed very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

The favourable, moderate, unfavourable and stress scenarios represent possible outcomes that have been calculated based on simulations using the reference asset's past performance over a period of up to 5 years. The amounts shown here consider two different scenarios (early call and maturity). In case you decide to exit before the product ends, exit costs may apply in addition to the amounts shown here.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 1 year and 6 months

The recommended holding period for the product is 1 year and 6 months as the product is designed to be held until maturity; however the product may terminate early due to an issuer call or an extraordinary event. You have no contractual right to terminate the product prior to maturity.

The manufacturer is under no obligation to make a secondary market in the product, but may repurchase the product prior to maturity on a case-by-case basis. In addition the product is expected to be listed on Borsa Italiana (SeDeX), which may provide you the possibility to sell the product prior to maturity via this exchange. In such circumstances, the price quoted will reflect a bid-ask spread and any costs associated with unwinding the hedging arrangements of the manufacturer in connection with the product. In addition, the person who sold you the product may charge you brokerage fees when you sell the product.

How can I complain?
